CHESAPEAKE BRISTOL CLUB NEWSLETTER JULY 14, 1975

REMINDER: This weekend (July 19th) is the date of the Club's rendezvous in Cornfield Creek on the North shore of the Magothy River. As was announced in previous Newsletters, Club Member Steve Grant has obtained permission for our Club Members to use the facilities of the "Mil-Bur" Community Beach in Cornfield Creek for a Club picnic and get-together. Our Club will supply the hot dogs, hamburgers and rolls. Each boat is asked to bring a covered dish such as potato salad, macaroni salad, cole slaw, homemade baked beans, or whatever other picnic type food you may wish to contribute. (A note here: Remember, if the weather is as warm as it has been lately, food can spoil very quickly if not refrigerated properly, so please keep your covered dish iced down.) There are picnic tables, bar-b-que grills, rest rooms and a swimming pool on the large tree shaded community grounds. Steve has even arranged to have the pool kept open from 8PM to midnight for our use. A professional lifeguard will be on duty at all times, so we won't have to worry about the kids. We certainly hope to have a large turn out for this affair. If you can't make it by boat, why not drive down. On a separate sheet of this letter, a map has been included to show you the way by land or sea. If you are planning to attend, we would greatly appreciate it if you would just call 789-8774 and let me (Bill Birely) or my wife Jan know: (1) your name (2) the number of people in your family and (3) what type of covered dish you are bringing. This would be a big help to us in our preparations.

RACING: There will be a race in the say outside the Magothy for those of you who would like a little competition. Remember, all boats are rated on a modified Delta rating system so that everyone has a fair chance of winning. Instructions for the race are on a later page in this letter.

Also, on the subject of racing, we would again like to mention the overnight race from Annapolis to Cove Point and back which will start at 3 o'clock Saturday, July 26th (next weekend). This race should be a great exercise in night navigation with plenty of opportunity to test your sailing skills. Inasmuch as this will be a long and somewhat tiring race, (Probably running into late Sunday morning or early afternoon), we would certainly advise each skipper to sign on as many qualified crew as he fiind for safety. If you are a skipper looking for extra crew, or are a good sailor looking for a crew position, call me at 789-8774, and I will try to arrange some matches. Even if you are a skipper who does not need additional crew, please call me and let me know of your intention to race.

A special Cove Point Trophy will be awarded to the winner of this race. Wouldn't you like to be aboard the winning boat?

July 19th Race at Magothy River:

Starting Line: Between committee boat and black bouy

C "3C" just east of Baktimore Light

outside the magothy.

Course: From C "3C" northeast to BW "13B" (leave

to starboard), SSE to flashing 4 sec. bouy "3" (leave to starboard) SW to flashing 4 sec. bell bout "1", (leave to starboard) NW

to finish line at C "3C".

Finish Line: Line between Baltimore Light and C "30".

First boat across line will mark his own time then immediately take up position to record finishing times of other racers.

Distance: 8.5 miles

Note: Depending on wind direction, a decision will

be made at the start of the race whether to sail a clockwise course as described or a reverse (counter-clockwise) course. Naturally, if reverse course is chosen, all bouys will be

left to port.

bell bouy "77" off Tolly Pt. Pass "77" to

port and continue NNW to finish line.

Finish Line: Line between " "3" and N "4" just north of

Tolly Pt. at entrance to Severn River. First boat across line will mark his own time, then

take up position to record time of other

finishers.

Distance: 76 miles

August 2nd Tilghman Creek:

Starting time: 11:00 10 min. 3 blasts

11:05 5 min. 2 "

11:10 Start

Starting line: Between committee boat and flamhing bell

bouy "77" off Tolly Pt. shoal.

Course: SSE to Eastern Bay leaving Bloody Pt.

lighthouse and flashing bell bouy "l" at the mouth of Eastern Bay to port, up Eastern Bay to finish line north off

Tilghman Pt.

Finish line: Finish line will be established by an

imaginary line drawn from red bouy N "6" to red bouy R "4" and extended NNE of R "4". You will have crossed the finish line when R "4" and N "6" are in direct line to starboard of your boat. First boat across line will mark his own time and then take up position to record

finishing times of other racers.

Distance: 14 miles
