

RACE INSTRUCTIONS TO TILGHMAN'S CREEK, MILES RIVER - JUNE 11, 1977 (Approx. 14.2 miles)

STARTING TIME: 11:00 AM 10 minute warning (3 horn blasts)
11:05 AM 5 minute warning (2 horn blasts)

11:10 AM START (1 horn blast)

STARTING LINE: Between Committee boat and flashing bell buoy "77" off Tolly Pt. shoal (outside Severn River).

COURSE: SSE to Eastern Bay leaving Bloody Point Light and flashing bell buoy "l" at the mouth of Eastern Bay to port.

FINISH LINE: Between R "4" and N "6" off Tilghman Point leaving R "4" to port and N "6" to starboard.

SPECIAL INSTRUCTIONS:

- 1. TIME LIMIT 5 hours (4:10 PM). If any boat finishes before expiration of time limit, the race is official and all boats will be scored.
- 2. Each racing yacht will keep its own sailing time from START HORN TO CROSSING FINISH LINE.
- 3. The first yacht to cross the finish line will take up a position at either end of the line and will note and record the finish time of the other yachts.
- 4. Headsails, working jibs and genoas only no spinnakers, staysails, drifters, etc...
- 5. REMINDER 1977 RULE: The Committee has not pre-run the race courses. If markers are missing, sail the course as if they were in their charted position carefully!!

COMMITTEE BOAT: If any of our members are near the starting line of this race and are not racing, it would be appreciated if you would volunteer to be committee boat.

BRISTOL 32 KACE

Saturday, June 18th, CBC will hold the second in a series of three races for the Bristol 32's. (The third and final race has been scheduled for September 10th.) Even if you missed the first race on May 21st, you still have a chance at the "silverware" because the winner of this series will be determined on the basis of accumulated points for his best two (2) races. It's still anybody's ballgame.

We're sorry that last minute difficulties forced us to conduct the first race without a committee boat on hand, but we will have a committee boat for this race. It will most likely be the white Bristol 30 "Jan-B". Look for her near red bouy "10C" (marker "H" on enclosed chart). Hail the race committee on the committee boat prior to the race and give them the following three items of information: 1-Your name, 2-Your sail number, 3-The size of your largest headsail on board (150%, 170%, etc.) We did not do it for the first race, but we are going to apply the handicap system in these next two races, based on the size of each boat's largest jib. Under this system, a 100% jib will have a waterline rating of 21.2. 120% - 21.4, 130% - 21.5, 150% - 21.6, 160% - 21.7, 170% - 21.8. Remember, NO drifters, spinnakers or staysails. Wisker pole length limited to 12'-6".

Raft up after the race in Cornfield Creek (Magothy).

STARTING TIME 11:59 30 White Flag Raised

12 Noon 3 Blasts of norm - White Flag dropped

12:04 30 Blue Flag Raised

12:05 2 Blasts of Horn - Blue Flag dropped 12:09 50 Red Flag Raised

12:10 - 1 Blast of Horn - Red Flag dropped

START at Drop of Flag - Horn is unofficial Boats over the line before start will be signalled by number and must return around either end of the line and restart. General recall for all boats will be repeated blasts of horn, in case too many boats are over. START LINE Between Bouy H (Fl.R 4 sec. R "10C") and committee boat. COURSE (See attached chart) Course will be selected from marks shown. depending upon wind conditions and direction! For clarification:

is R #12# F is Fl R 4 sec R "2C" is Fl 6 sec "ll" G. is Qk Fl R Bell R "6C"

is rl 4 sec Bell "5" Ħ is Fl R 4 sec R "10C"

is Fl 4 sec Ra Ref #3# is Qk Fl R R "16C"

is Fl 4 sec Bell "1" K C #3#

Round marks in order shown on Committee Boat - Red Square exhibited with marks means leave marks to port. Green square means leave marks to starboard. FINISH LINE Between Bony H (Fl R 4 sec. R "10C") and committee boat from direction of the last mark. If race must be shortened due to wind conditions, Committee Boat (showing a RED flag) will be stationed at one of the marks of the course in which case finish line will be between that mark and committee boat.
