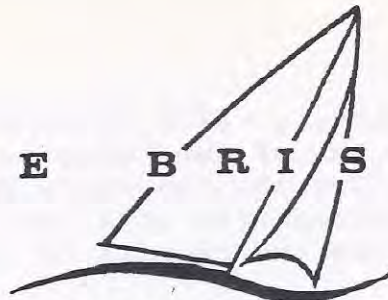




# C H E S A P E A K E     B R I S T O L     C L U B

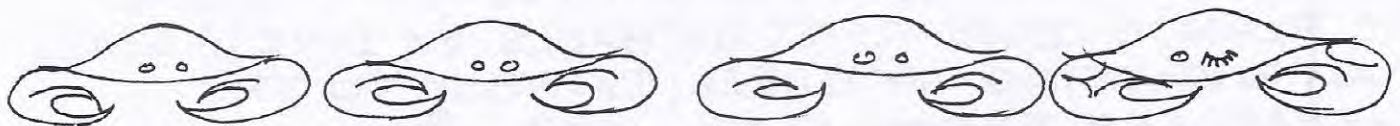
Our next event is one we always look forward to.. even if it does mean the club's summer activities are coming to a close... This is the time to tie a bib around your neck, collect up those mallets and crab knives and dig into those mountains of "georgeous" crabs steaming on the tables in front of you at the Bay Ridge Civic Association Clubhouse on Lake Ogleton's shore. Marcia Outerbridge will have the crabs, beer, punch, tableware, plates and cups waiting for us at 1600 after we have joined the round-the-buoys race. (The race instructions and chartlet are in this newsletter, so don't lose it!)

This event will be held rain or shine since there is a screened club house on the site if we have to move the feast indoors. For non-crab lovers, grills and charcoal will be available for you grillables. Each family should bring a salad or dessert to share.

Lake Ogleton entrance is NW of Tolly Point. Be sure that #1 and #5 flashers stay lined up between your fore and aft stays. Don't let the tide carry you out of the channel. (note local knowledge: Tom and Marcia Outerbridge's EASTING DOWN carries 5' in and out with no problem.)

Head east on Forest Drive (Rt. 665) from Rt. 2 at Parole. Keep going straight on Bay Ridge Road. (after the 7th light from Rt. 2, Forest Drive becomes Bay Ridge Road.) At Diehl's Produce keep left for Bay Ridge. Go through Bay Ridge gates and continue for .4 mile. Take the first left onto East Lake Drive. Bear right at the bottom of the hill and go .4 mile more. The Clubhouse sign is on the left.

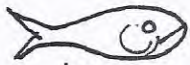

# ROUND THE BUOYS & GULLS RACE

SEPTEMBER 18, 1982

- RENDEZVOUS:** The post race rendezvous is in Lake Ogleton.
- STARTING LINE:** The starting line will be between the Committee Boat's mast and Mark M "77" Bell F1 4 sec off Tolly Pt.
- FINISH LINE:** The finish line will be between the Committee Boat's mast and Mark M unless the course is shortened by the Committee Boat being repositioned at a mark of the course. A yacht finishes from the direction of the last turning mark.
- COURSE:** The course to be sailed will be designated by letters displayed on the Committee Boat. Round marks in the order displayed, reading left to right. A red placard means to leave the following marks to port, the green placard means to leave the following marks to starboard. For example:

red · E D grn S A B

means to leave E and D to port; S, A, and B to starboard. The marks of the course are defined on the attached sketch.

|                          | 1110 | START - Red flag raised | - 1 horn blast  |

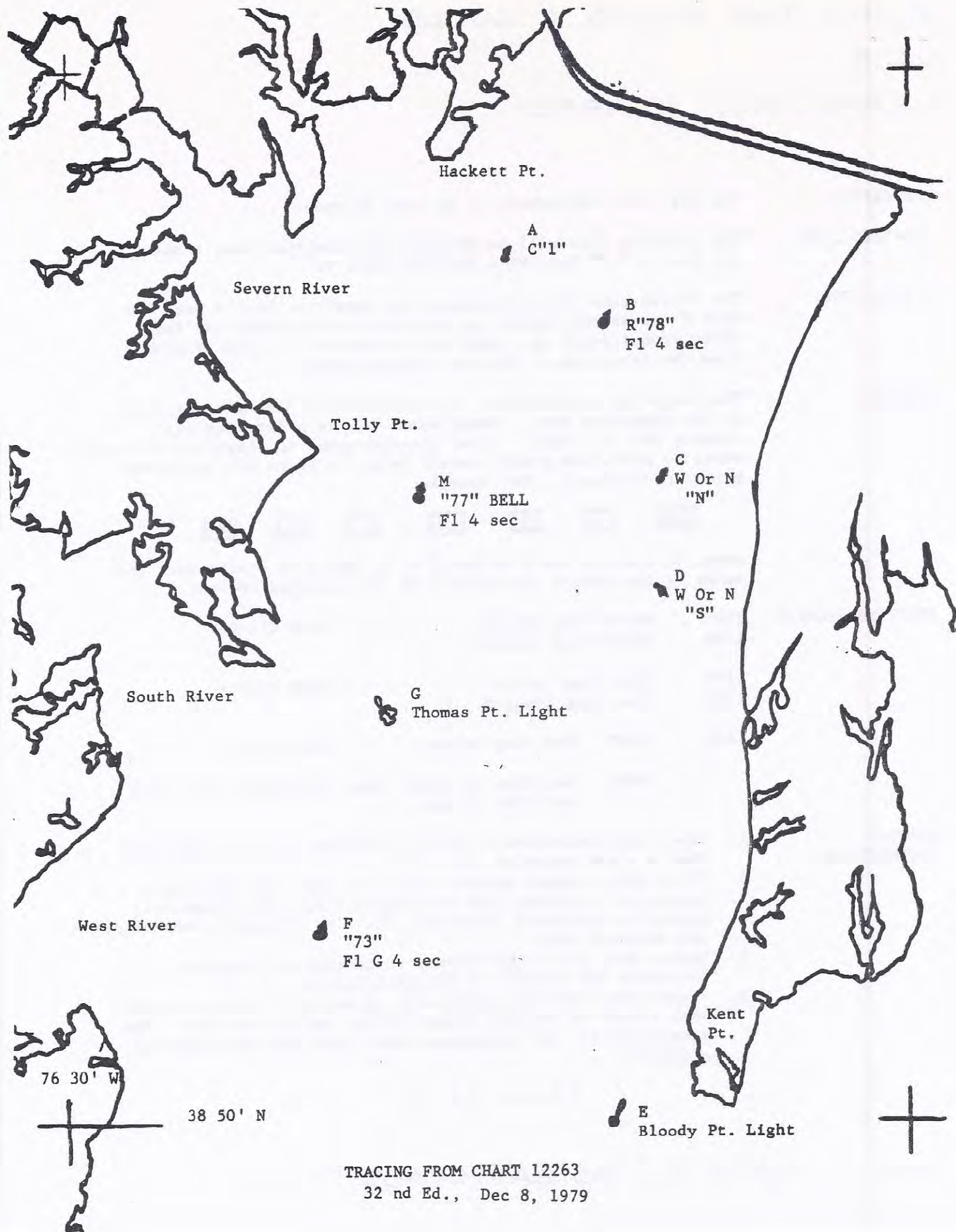
**NOTE:** Hoisting of flags takes precedence over horn and time of day.

- SPECIAL INSTRUCTIONS:**
1. State your intention to race by sailing past the Committee Boat's stern prior to 1100.
  2. Fly a white signal approx. 12" x 12" from the backstay.
  3. Headsails - working jibs and genoas only. No spinnakers, staysails, drifters, flashers, etc. No foresail combinations - one headsail only.
  4. Racers must give right-of-way to commercial shipping. Violators are subject to disqualification.
  5. Yachts over the line early will be hailed. Early starters must return to restart around either end of the line. The responsibility for returning shall rest with the yacht(s) concerned.

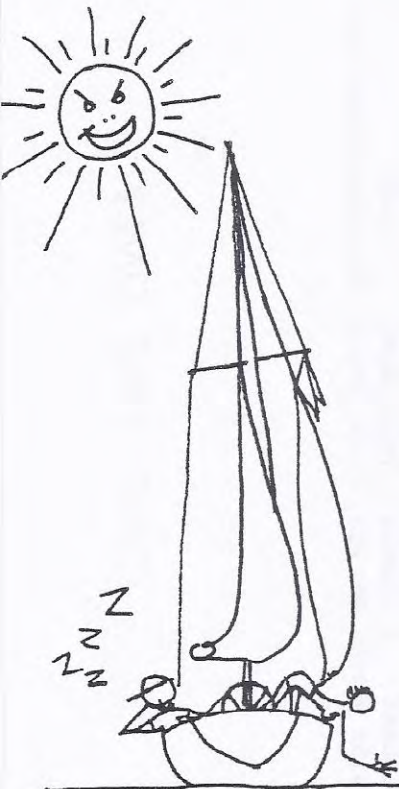
