### 1983 ANNUAL LADIES RACE - July 23, 1983

In Swan Creek RENDEZVOUS:

The Starting Line will be between the Committee Boat's START LINE:

mast and BW N"12B" (058 mag, 1.6 nm from Baltimore Light).

If a Committee Boat is on station, a yacht will finish when crossing the line between the Committee Boat's mast FINISH LINE:

and BW N"27B" (038 mag, 3 nm from Love Point). If no Committee Boat is on station, a yacht will finish when N"27B" is within 50 yards to port and upon crossing a

line extended due south (mag) from it. Each yacht must

take its own time.

Leave to STBD N "13B", 058 mag, 3.2 nm from Baltimore Light Leave to PORT R "6C", Qk Fl R Bell in Craighill Channel

Leave to PORT BW "LP" Mo(A), 280 mag, 2.4 nm from Love PT

Leave to STBD "3", Fl 4 Sec at south end of Swan Point Channel

(Based on NOS Chart 12273 corrected to 11 JUL 81) 15.5 nm DISTANCE:

White Flag Raised - 3 horn blasts 1200 STARTING

White Flag Lowered 1204 SIGNALS:

> Blue Flag Raised - 2 horn blasts 1205

Blue Flag Lowered 1209

START - Red Flag Raised - 1 horn blast 1210

Hoisting of flags takes precedence over horn and NOTE:

6 hours. Any yacht finishing within the time limit makes the race valid for all starters regardless of the time. TIME LIMIT: If you are in the lead and time is short, please notify

SPECIAL INSTRUCTIONS:

Review the racing rules in the 1983 CBC Directory. 1.

A female skipper must be at the helm and in command of the yacht at all times.

State your intention to race by sailing past the Committee Boat's stern prior to 1200 hours.

Fly a white flag (approx. 12" x 12") from the backstay.

Racers must give right-of-way to commercial shipping. Violators are subject to disqualification.

Racers must keep their own elapsed time, to the second, from the START. Make a not of the yachts finishing

ahead and astern of you. 7. Yachts over the starting line early will be hailed. Early starters must return to restart around either end of the line. The responsibility for returning shall rest with the yacht(s) concerned.

## INSTRUCTIONS FOR MILBUR SHORE PARTY RACE/CRUISE #4

DATE:

Saturday, August 6, 1983

START LINE: The Starting Line will be between the Committee Boat's mast and Mark Y, BW N "12B".

FINISH LINE:

The Finish Line will be between the Committee Boat's mast and Mark Y unless the course is shortened by the Committee Boat being repositioned at a mark of the course. A yacht finishes from the direction of the last turning mark.

COURSE:

The course to be sailed will be designated by letters displayed on the Committee Boat. Round marks in order displayed, reading left to right. A RED placard means leave the following marks to PORT. A GREEN placard means leave the following marks to STARBOARD. For example:

GRN RED

means to leave E and D to port; B, A, and C to starboard. Marks of the course are defined on the attached sketch.

STARTING SIGNALS:

3 horn blasts White Flag Raised 1100 White Flag Lowered

1104 2 horn blasts

Blue Flag Raised 1105 Blue Flag Lowered 1109

START Red Flag Raised - 1 horn blast 1110

Hoisting of flags takes precedence over horn and NOTE: time of day.

TIME LIMIT:

4 hours. Any yacht finishing in the time allowed makes a valid race for all starters, regardless of the time limit.

#### SPECIAL INSTRUCTIONS:


- Review the Racing Rules in the CBC 1983 Directory. 1.
- 2. State your intention to race by sailing past the Committee Boat's stern prior to 1100 hours.
  - 3. Fly a white signal (approx. 12" x 12") from the backstay.
  - Headsails working jibs and genoas only. No spinnakers, staysails, drifters, flashers, etc. No foresail combinations - one headsail only.
  - Racers must give right-of-way to commercial shipping. Violators are subject to disqualification.
  - 6. Yachts over the Starting Line early will be hailed by sail number and must return to restart around either end of the line. The responsibility for returning shall rest with the yacht(s) concerned.




