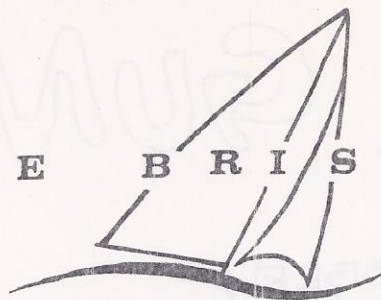




CHESAPEAKE BRISTOL CLUB

Six courageous competitors circumnavigated the course from countdown to conclusion and here are their corrected times:

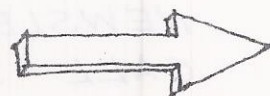
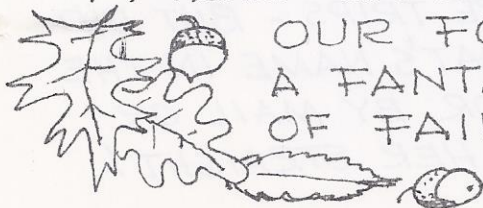
