### Help Wanted:

When the U.S. Coast Guard says it wants to rent out waterfront property in Anne Arundel County, it isn't kidding.

The agency is looking for a civilian to take over care of the Thomas Point Lighthouse, which is surrounded by the Chesapeake Bay. So far it has at least 68 applicants who have indicated a desire to act as caretaker for the 109-year-old facility, a move that will help the Coast Guard cut its budget.

The lighthouse is undergoing renovations and is expected to be fully automated and ready for occupancy next year. "The civilian caretakers would have to pay rent and have all the duties of anyone who rents a house," said Cmdr. Leo Tyo, chief of aids to navigation in the Chesapeake Bay. "Obviously they wouldn't have to cut the grass."

But, Tyo noted, some applicants do not realize that the lighthouse, which has a beacon that can be seen 13 miles away, is two miles from the nearest land.

"We don't have the finer details worked out yet, but the caretakers will need their own boat," 'he said. In addition, Tyo said, the Coast Guard wants someone who can be self-sufficient during the winter months when rough seas and freezing weather can make the lighthouse inaccessible.
