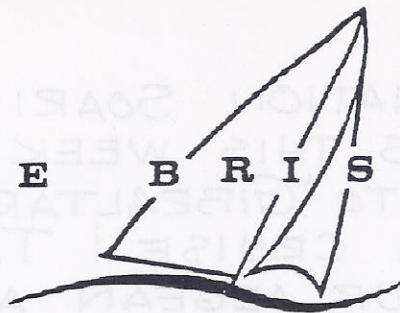




CHESAPEAKE BRISTOL CLUB

welcomed each Lebowitz, Longman and Marsh to the crew!

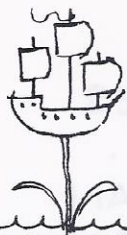
The Goods, the Dickiesons and Plitts at the fete

to his landlocked bunk went each and every one!

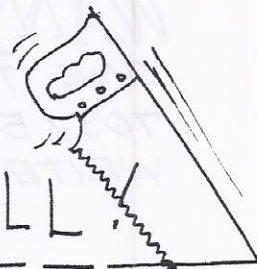

Would you like to really get away from it all?

Help Wanted:

When the U.S. Coast Guard says it wants to rent out waterfront property in Anne Arundel County, it isn't kidding.

The agency is looking for a civilian to take over care of the Thomas Point Lighthouse, which is surrounded by the Chesapeake Bay. So far it has at least 68 applicants who have indicated a desire to act as caretaker for the 109-year-old facility, a move that will help the Coast Guard cut its budget.

The lighthouse is undergoing renovations and is expected to be fully automated and ready for occupancy next year.

"The civilian caretakers would have to pay rent and have all the duties of anyone who rents a house," said Cmdr. Leo Tyo, chief of aids to navigation in the Chesapeake Bay. "Obviously they wouldn't have to cut the grass."

But, Tyo noted, some applicants do not realize that the lighthouse, which has a beacon that can be seen 13 miles away, is two miles from the nearest land.

"We don't have the finer details worked out yet, but the caretakers will need their own boat," he said. In addition, Tyo said, the Coast Guard wants someone who can be self-sufficient during the winter months when rough seas and freezing weather can make the lighthouse inaccessible.

Race number one!

INSTRUCTIONS FOR THE RHODE RIVER RACE - 12 MAY, 1984
Racing Rules used by CBC are printed in the Directory

Rendezvous: In the Rhode River due west of "7", Fl G 4 sec.

Starting Line: Between the committee boat's mast and "77" off Tolly Point (Mark M on Annapolis Area Chart).

Finish Line: If a committee boat is on station, a yacht will finish between it and "73" Fl G 4 sec (Mark X).
If no committee boat is on station, a yacht will finish when "73" is within 50 yards to starboard, and upon crossing a line extended due east (mag) of it.

Course: Leave to starboard C"1" (Mark A) 1.1 mi SSE Hacketts Point
Leave to starboard R"78" (Mark B) 2 mi SSW Cheas. Bay Bridge
Leave to port R"2" (Mark X) entrance to Annapolis Channel
Leave to starboard W or N "N" (Mark C) north end measured mile
The course has not been pre-sailed. If a mark is missing, round or finish at the plotted position.

Distance: 13.2 miles

Starting Signals: 1100 - White flag raised - 3 horn blasts
1104 - White flag lowered
1105 - Blue flag raised - 2 horn blasts
1109 - Blue flag lowered
1110 - START - Red flag raised - 1 horn blast

Note: Hoisting of flags takes precedence over horn and time of day.

Time Limit: 5 hours. One yacht finishing within the limit makes the race valid for all other yachts, regardless of the time limit.

Special Instructions:

- (a) State your intention to race by sailing past the Committee boat's stern prior to 1100.
- (b) Fly a white flag (approx. 12" x 12") from the backstay.
- (c) Headsails - working jibs and genoas only. No spinnakers, staysails, flashers, etc. No foresail combinations - one headsail only.
- (d) Racers must give way to commercial shipping. Violators are subject to disqualification.
- (e) Racers must keep their own elapsed time, to the second, from the START. Make a note of the yachts finishing ahead and astern of you.
- (f) If no committee boat is on station at the finish or the Race Committee is absent from the rendezvous, call in your elapsed time by wednesday night following the race to (301) 823-1278
- (g) Yachts over the starting line early will be hailed. Early starters must return to restart around either end of the line. The responsibility for returning shall rest with the yacht(s) concerned.

INSTRUCTION FOR CHOPTANK RIVER RACE - SUNDAY, 27 MAY 1984
Observe CBC rules printed in the Directory

Rendezvous: Caulk Cove off Leadenham Cr off Broad Creek.

Starting Line: Between Committee Boat's mast and R"14" Fl R 5 sec.

Finish Line: If a Committee boat is on station, a yacht will finish between it and "1" Fl 4 sec. at entrance to Broad Creek. If no Committee boat is on station, a yacht shall finish when "1" is within 50 yards to port and upon crossing a line extended due east (mag) from it.

Course: Leave to starboard R "12 B" Fl 2.5 sec 1 mi ENE Todds Pt.
Leave to starboard R "12" Fl 2.5 sec. 1.1 mi NE Cook Pt.
Leave to port R "12A" Ok Fl 1.7 mi NNW Todds Pt.
Leave to starboard B/W N "62B" 2.1 mi N Cook Pt.

Distance: 11.1 miles

Starting Signals: 12:00 - White flag raised - 2 horn blasts
12:04 - White flag lowered
12:05 - Blue flag raised - 2 horn blasts
12:09 - Blue flag lowered
12:10 - START - Red flag raised - 1 horn blast

NOTE: Hoisting of flags takes precedence over horn and time of day.

Time Limited: 4 hours. One yacht finishing within the limit makes the race valid for all other yachts, regardless of the time limit.

Special Instructions:

- (a) State your intention to race by sailing past the Committee boat's stern prior to 1100.
- (b) Fly a white flag (approx. 12" x 12") from the backstay.
- (c) Headsails - working jibs and genoas only. No spinnakers, staysails, flashers, etc. No foresail combinations - one headsail only.
- (d) Racers must give way to commercial shipping. Violators are subject to disqualification.
- (e) Racers must keep their own elapsed time, to the second, from the start. Make a note of the yachts finishing ahead and astern of you.

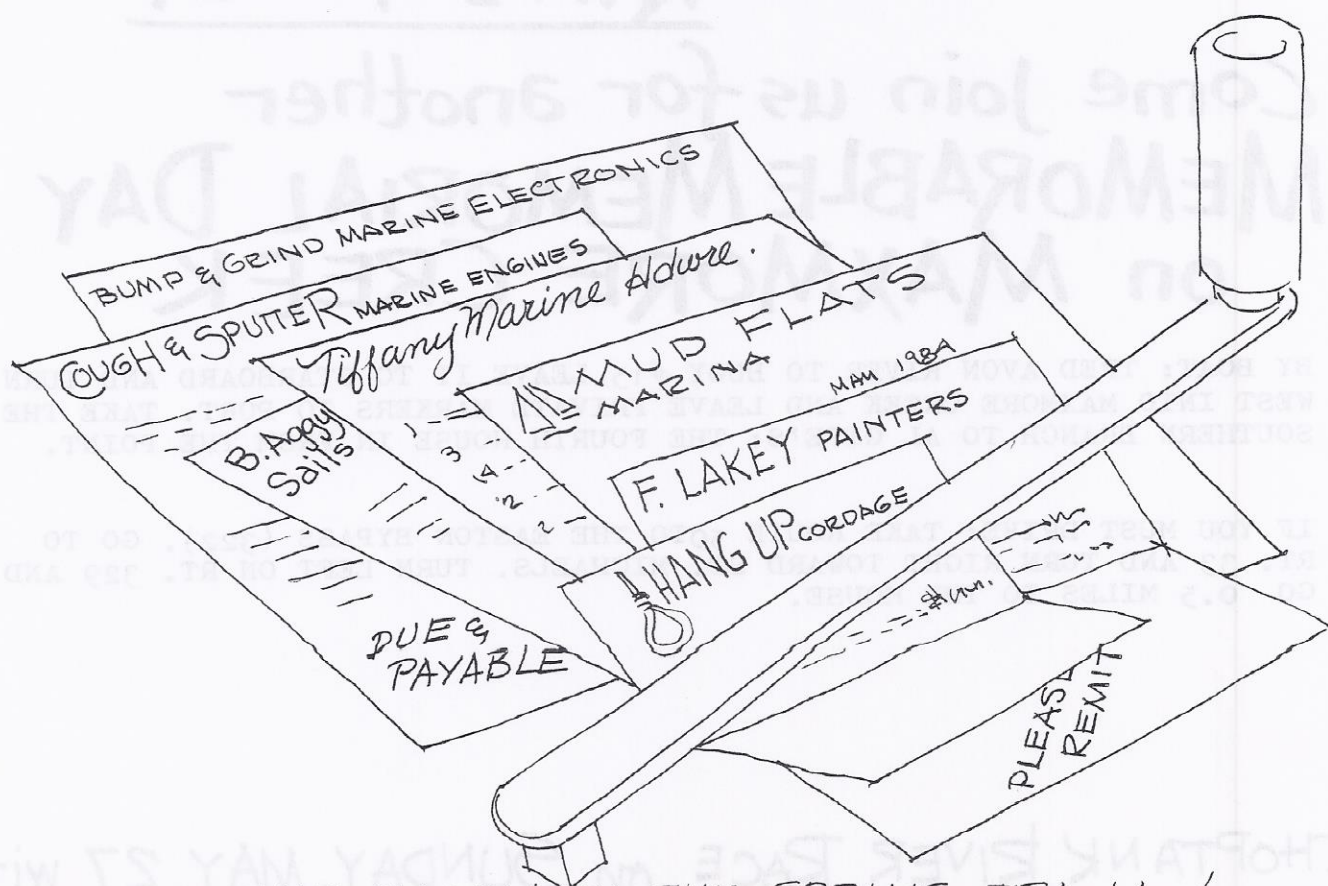
