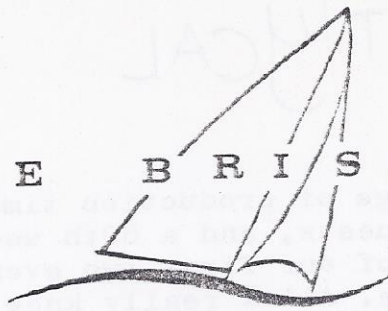

A CAUTIONARY CORRESPONDENCE FROM THE COAST GUARD

MARYLAND - CHESAPEAKE BAY - BALTIMORE AREA

Mariners operating or anchoring small craft near SEVEN FOOT KNOLL LIGHT (LL 2777) are advised of the danger which exists from large waves in the vicinity. As a large vessel transits CRAIGHILL CHANNEL and BREWERTON CHANNEL EASTERN EXTENSION near the light, the waves propagated grow in magnitude upon reaching the shoal water area. Wave heights of ten to twelve feet have been reported. Several injuries and a death have occurred. Mariners are urged to transit this area with extreme caution.

Observe CBC rules printed in the Directory

Rendezvous: Langford Creek, Chester River

Starting Line: Between Committee Boat's mast and N "12B" B/W
(1.6 miles NE Baltimore Light)

Finish Line: If a committee boat is on station, a yacht will finish between it and "9" FL 4 sec. Chester River S of Cedar Pt. If no committee boat is on station, a yacht shall finish when "9" is within 50 yards to PORT and upon crossing a line extended due south (mag) from it.

Course: Leave to starboard N "13 B" B/W 1.6 mi NE N"12B"
Leave to port BW "LP" MOA 2.4" WNW of Love Pt.
Leave to starboard "R8" Ok Fl R 1.9 mi WSW of C"3" Swan Point Bar
Leave to port "R6" Fl R 4sec (Chester River) 1.4 mi SSE of Love Point Light

Distance: 16.1 miles

Starting: 11:00 - White flag raised - 2 horn blasts
11:04 - White flag lowered
11:05 - Blue flag raised - 2 horn blasts
11:09 - Blue flag lowered
11:10 - START - Red flag raised - 1 horn blast

NOTE: Hoisting of flags takes precedence over horn and time of day.

Time Limit: 5 hours. One yacht finishing within the limit makes the race valid for all other yachts, regardless of the time limit.

Special Instructions:

(a) State your intention to race by sailing past the Committee boat's stern prior to 1100.

(b) Fly a white flag (approx. 12" x 12") from the backstay.

(c) Headsails - working jibs and genoas only. No spinnakers, staysails, flashers, etc. No foresail combinations - one headsail only.

(d) Racers must give way to commercial shipping. Violators are subject to disqualification.

(e) Racers must keep their own elapsed time, to the second, from the start. Make a note of the yachts finishing ahead and astern of you.

(f) If no committee boat is on station at the finish or the Race Committee is absent from the rendezvous, call in your elapsed time by Wednesday night following the race to Dick Boecker (301) 823-1278.

(g) Yachts over the starting line early will be hailed. Early starters must return to restart around either end of the line. The responsibility for returning shall rest with the yacht(s) concerned.

COVE POINT OVERNIGHT JUNE 16, 1984

STARTING LINE: The Starting line will be between the Committee Boat's mast and "77" BELL Fl 4 sec off Tolly Pt.

FINISH LINE: A yacht will finish when "77" BELL Fl 4 sec is within 50 yards to starboard, and upon crossing a line extended due west (magnetic) of it. Each yacht must take it's own time.

COURSE: Southerly to BW "CP" Mo (A) 2.0 mi west of Taylors Is. Round BW "CP" Mo (A) leaving it to starboard, then northerly to the finish.

TIME LIMIT: None.

SPECIAL INSTRUCTIONS:

1. State your intention to race by sailing past the Committee Boat's stern prior to 1600.
2. Fly a white signal (approx. 12" x 12") from the backstay.
3. Headsails-working jibs and genoas only. No spinnakers, staysails, drifters, flasher, etc. No foresail combinations - one headsail only.
4. Racers must give right-of-way to commercial shipping. Violaters are subject to disqualification.
5. Racers must keep their own elapsed time, to the second, from the START signal. Make a note of the yachts finishing ahead and astern of you.
6. Boats over the line early will be hailed and must return to restart around either end of the start line. The responsibility for returning shall rest with the yacht(s) concerned.
7. Running lights must be displayed from sunset to sunrise. During this period a yacht will illuminate the sails with spreader lights or a powerful beam if approached by a large vessel. You may direct a light toward the bridge of a ship but not a cockpit of another sailboat.
8. All starters should report their times to Dick Boecker 301-823-1278
9. In addition to CG required safety equipment (now including day/night alert/locate devices) it is recommended that all yachts carry a radar reflector at the spreader, a man overboard float and light. It is also recommended that crew members wear safety harnesses whenever they leave the cockpit.

RENDEZVOUS: CITY RECREATION PIER, Fell's Point, AT FOOT OF BROADWAY

START LINE: Between Committee Boat's mast and BW N "12B" 1.6 mi NE of Baltimore Light.

FINISH LINE: If a Committee Boat is on station, a yacht will finish between it and Qk Fl "1M" Location 1.2 mi SE of Key Bridge. If no Committee Boat is on station, a yacht will finish when Qk Fl "1M" is within 50 yards to starboard, and upon crossing a line extended due south (magnetic) of it.

COURSE: Leave to port N "17B".
Leave to starboard Fl R 6 sec 42 ft on Sevenfoot Knoll.

DISTANCE: 12.8 miles

START SIGNALS:	1100	White flag raised	3 horn blasts
	1104	White flag lowered	
	1105	Blue flag raised	2 horn blasts

NOTE: Hoisting of flags takes precedence over horn and time of day.

TIME LIMIT: 6 hours. Any yacht finishing within the limit shall make the race valid for all other yachts in the race, regardless of the time limit. If you finish before the time limit, notify other racers via VHF. If you are leading and it appears the time limit will not be met, report your position to others via VHF and by mutual consent of the racers, the time limit can be extended. Everyone tune in on VHF, Channel 16 at 4:10 P.M. for a progress report from the lead boat.

 2. Fly a white signal (approx. 12" x 12") from the backstay.

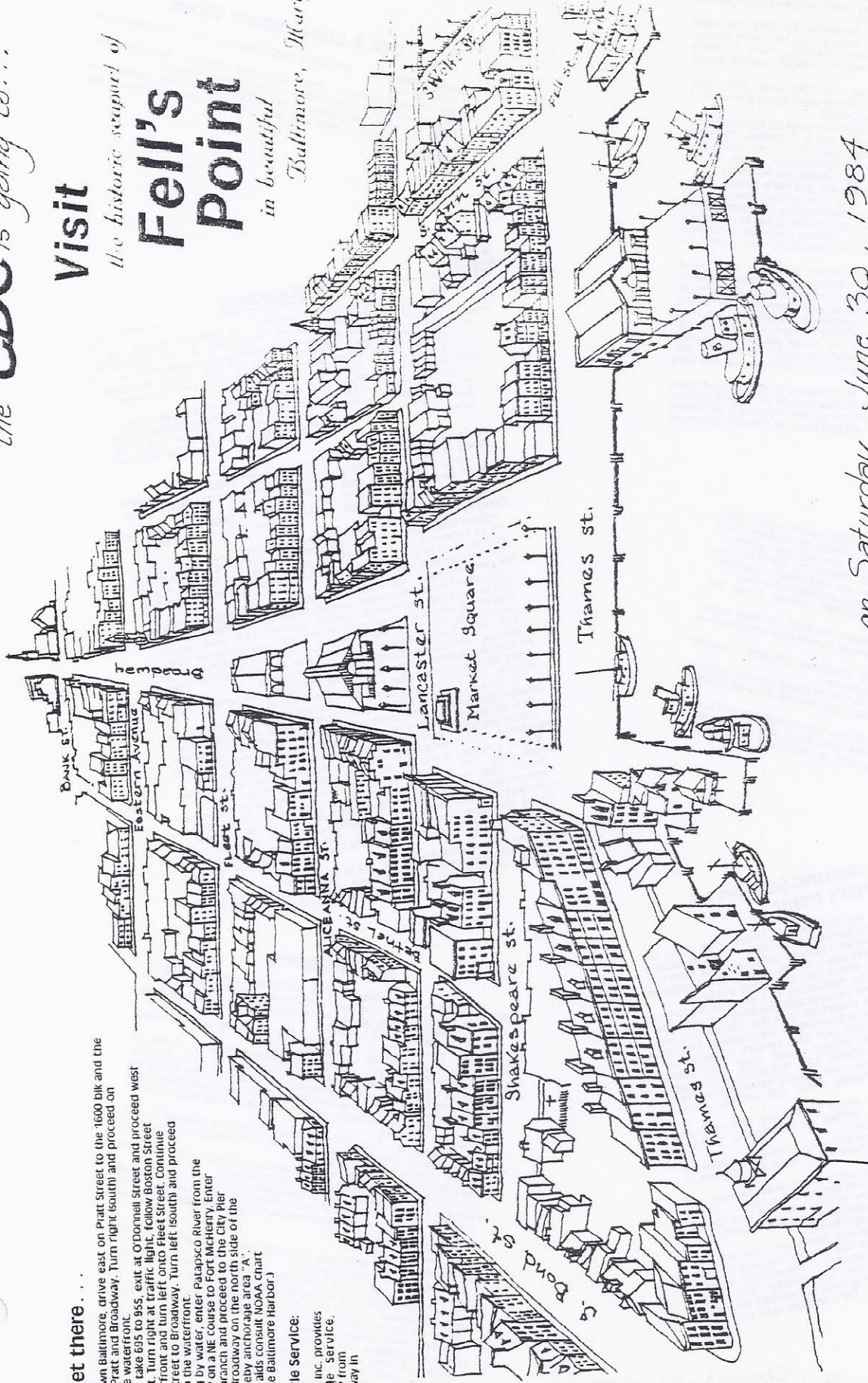
From the east take 695 to 955, exit at O'Donnell Street and proceed west to Boston Street. Turn right at traffic light, follow Boston Street along the waterfront and turn left onto Fleet Street. Continue west on Fleet Street to Broadway. Turn left (south) and proceed on Broadway to the waterfront.

When arriving by water, enter Patapsco River from the Chesapeake Bay on a NE course to Fort McHenry. Enter the Northeast Branch and proceed to the City Pier at the foot of Broadway on the north side of the Harbor closely anchorage area "A". For navigation aids consult NOAA chart No. 12281 of the Baltimore Harbor.)

1784 TO THE HISTORIC SEAPORT OF

FELL'S POINT ON THE PATAPSCO!

Fell's Point is a federally designated historic district...a port-side neighborhood that dates back to 1730.. and still has its cobblestone streets and 350 original residential structures. It is the home of the multi-ethnic Broadway Market. The area is now undergoing much restoration and the club has arranged for a special opening of three privately owned sea captains' homes nearby the pier. The tour would be between the hours of 5:00 and 6:00 PM on Saturday, June 30 for our group only. The Captain Lambdin House, owned by Mr. and Mrs. Anthony Norris; the Captain John Steele house, owned by Dr. and Mrs. Hepner; and a third house, owned by Mr. John Gleason and Mr. Robert Evey, which has been featured in Better Homes and Gardens. (For the privilege of visiting each home and to assist in their preservation a small contribution of \$1.00/home is requested)

The club can also arrange a tour of the Browns Wharf Maritime Museum if enough folks are interested. It is only a block from our pier.

Pick up some goodies at the market or one of the carry-outs, or join your friends and try one of the good restaurants near the dock... or if you wish to join the square dancers in the inner harbor, take the water taxi on into town.

For those who want a wee tot to start the day: Mimosas or Bloody Marys at \$1.85 ea.

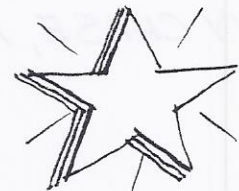
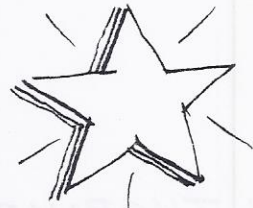
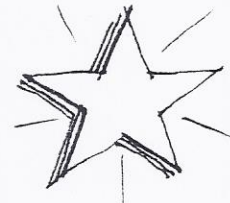
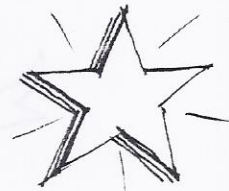
