#### CLASS RACE : BRISTOL 29.9 & BRISTOL 32 AUGUST 7, 1982

RENDEZVOUS:

Racers and all Club members and guests are invited to rendezvous Friday and Saturday nights in Bodkin Creek.

START LINE:

Between the Committee Boat's mast and Mark Y, BW N "12B".

FINISH LINE:

The finish line will be between the Committee Boat's mast and Mark Y unless the course is shortened by the Committee Boat being repositioned at a mark of the course. A Yacht finishes from the direction of the last turning mark.

COURSE:

The course to be sailed will be designated by letters displayed on the Committee Boat. Round marks in the order displayed, reading left to right. A red placard means to leave the following marks to port, a green placard means to leave the following marks to starboard. For example:

red E D grn S A B

means to leave E and D to port; S, A, and B to starboard. The marks of the course are defined on the attached sketch.

START SIGNALS:

1100 1104	White flag raised White flag lowered	3 horn blasts
1105 1109	Blue flag raised Blue flag lowered	2 horn blasts
1110	START 32 - Red flag raised	l horn blast
1114	Red flag lowered START 29.9 - Red flag raised	l horn blast

NOTE: Hoisting of flags takes precedence over horn and time of day.

### SPECIAL INSTRUCTIONS:

1. State your intention to race by sailing past the Committee Boat's stern prior to the warning signal.

2. Fly a white signal (approx 12" x 12") from your backstay.

3. Headsails: Working Jibs and Genoas only. No Spinnakers, Staysails, Drifters, Flashers, etc. No foresail combinations.. one headsail only.

4. Racers must give right-of-way to commercial shipping. Violators are subject to disqualification.

5. Yachts over the line early will be hailed by number and must return to restart around either end of the line.

6. A general recall will be signaled by repeated blasts of the horn. All boats must return behind the start line around the ends of the line and not interfere with the class preparing to start. Recalled classes will be restarted after all starts have been completed, beginning with the white flag signaling the normal sequence. If the class ahead of you is recalled, proceed as though they had started.

7. Each yacht will remain at least 150 yards behind the start line and its extensions until her preparatory signal has been made.

# BALTIMORE HARBOR RACE AUGUST 21, 1982

RENDEZVOUS .:

Inner Harbor - Pier 5.

START LINE:

Between Committee Boat's mast and BW N "12B" 1.6 mi NE of Baltimore Light.

FINISH LINE:

If a Committee Boat is on station, a yacht will finish between it and Qk Fl "lM" Location 1.2 mi SE of Key Bridge. If no Committee Boat is on station, a yacht will finish when Qk Fl "lM" is within 50 yards to starboard, and upon crossing a line extended due south (magnetic) of it.

COURSE:

Leave to port N "17B". Leave to starboard F1 R 6 sec 42 ft on Sevenfoot Knoll.

DISTANCE:

12.8 miles

START SIGNALS:

1100	White flag raised 3 horn blasts White flag lowered
1105 1109	Blue flag raised 2 horn blasts Blue flag lowered
1110	START - Red flag raised 1 horn blast
	NOTE: Hoisting of flags takes precedence

TIME LIMIT:

6 hours. Any yacht finishing within the limit shall make the race valid for all other yachts in the race, regardless of the time limit. If you finish before the time limit, notify other racers via VHF. If you are leading and it appears the time limit will not be met, report your position to others via VHF and by mutual consent of the racers, the time limit can be extended. Everyone tune in on VHF, Channel 16 at 4:10 P.M. for a progress report from the lead boat.

## SPECIAL INSTRUCTIONS:

- State your intention to race by sailing past the Committee Boat's stern prior to 1100.
- Fly a white signal (approx. 12" x 12") from the backstay.
- Headsails-working jibs and genoas only. No spinnakers, staysails, drifters, flashers, etc. No foresail combinations.
- Racers must give right-of-way to commercial shipping.
   Violators are subject to disqualification.
- 5. Racers must keep their own elapsed time, to the second, from the 1110 start signal. Make a note of the yachts finishing ahead and astern of you. Report time of finish to Ed Plitt (301) 255-5827.
- 6. Boats over the line early will be hailed by number and must return to restart around either end of the start line. The responsibility for returning shall rest with the yacht(s) concerned.

#### COMMODORE'S CUP RACE: SEPTEMBER 5, 1982

NOTICE:

It takes 3 starters to make a race, otherwise race will be postponed.

RENDEZVOUS:

The pre-race social activities are at the Milbur Shore Party in the Magothy River. Post-race rendezvous in Swan Creek.

START LINE:

Between Committee Boat's mast and Mark Y, BW N "12B".

FINISH LINE: Between the Committee Boat's mast and Mark Y unless the course is shortened by Committee Boat being repositioned at a mark of the course. A yacht finishes from the direction of the last turning mark.

COURSE:

The course to be sailed will be designated by letters displayed on the Committee Boat. Round marks in the order displayed, reading left to right. A red placard means to leave the following marks to port, the green placard means to leave the following marks to starboard. For example:

grn red

means to leave E and D to port; S, A, and B to starboard. The marks of the course are defined on the attached sketch.




