


## CHESAPEAKE

The Lake Ogleton entrance is NW of Tolly Point. Be sure that #1 and #5 flashers stay lined up with your fore and aft stays. Don't let the tide carry you out of the channel. (Tom and Marcia Outerbridge's EASTING DOWN carries 5' in and out with no trouble).

To reach the Bay Ridge Civic Association Clubhouse by land, head east on Forest Drive (Rt. 665) from Rt. #2 at Parole. Keep going straight and go past 9 (count 'em) traffic lights from #2 and you will be on Bay Ridge Road. Go through the Bay Ridge gates and continue for .4 mi. Take the first left onto East Lake Drive. Bear right at the bottom of the hill and go .4 mi. more. The sign for the clubhouse is on the left. There's plenty of parking!

# PREPARE TO FACE THE CRABS WITH RACE



INSTRUCTIONS FOR THE CRAB FEAST RACE (RACE #4) - AUGUST 8, 1987

RENDEZVOUS : Lake Ogelton, at the mouth of the Severn River.

START LINE : Between the Committee boat's mast and "77" Bell Fl 4 sec off Tolly Point.

:Leave to port C"75", south of Thomas Point Light. COURSE

Leave to port W OR N"S", South end of the measured mile. Leave to starboard R"2" at the entrance to Annapolis Channel.

Leave to port R"78" Fl 4 sec, 2 miles SSW of the Bay Bridge.

FINISH LINE: If a Committee boat is on station, a yacht will finish between it and C"5" in the Annapolis Channel. If no Committee boat is on station, a yacht will finish when C"5" is within 50 yards to starboard and upon crossing a line extended 180 degrees magnetic from it.

:12.1 nm. DISTANCE

#### STARTING SIGNALS:

1200 - White flag raised - 3 horn blasts

1204 - White flag lowered

1205 - Blue flag raised - 2 horn blasts

1209 - Blue flag lowered

1210 - START - Red flag raised - 1 horn blast

NOTE : Hoisting of flag takes precedence over horn and time of day.

TIME LIMIT : 4 hours. One yacht finishing within the time limit makes a race valid for all yachts.

NOTE : The race can be shortened at any turning mark. In that case a yacht will finish between the mark and the Committee boat from the direction of the previous mark. Keep your radio tuned to channel #16 for instructions.

#### SPECIAL INSTRUCTIONS:

1) State your intention to race by sailing past the Committee boat's stern prior to starting.

2) Fly a white flag (approx. 12"x12") from the backstay.

3) Working jibs and genoas only. No spinnakers, drifters, staysails, flashers, etc. No foresail combinations - one headsail only.

4) Racers must give way to commercial shipping. Violators are subject to disqualification.

5) Racers must keep their own elapsed time, to the second, from the start.

Make a note of the yachts finishing ahead and astern of you.

- 6) If no Committee boat is on station at the finish or the Race Committee is absent from the rendezvous, call in your time by Wednesday night following the race. Phone Fred Hixon at 301-266-0790.
- 7) Yachts over the starting line early will be hailed. Early starters must return to restart around either end of the line. The responsibility for returning shall rest with the yacht(s) concerned.

8) If you are leading and time is short, please notify the "trailers" that you finished, or did not, within the time limit. Don't make your friends sail and wonder while you motor to the party.

INSTRUCTIONS FOR THE DIVIDING CREEK RACE (RACE #5) - AUGUST 22, 1987

RENDEZVOUS : Dividing Creek, East Branch of the Wye River.

START LINE : Between the Committee boat's mast and "77" off Tolly Point.

:Leave to port Bloody Point Light. COURSE

Leave to port Bell "1" Fl 4 sec, South of Bloody Point. Leave to starboard R "4" Fl R 4 sec off Tilghman Point.

FINISH LINE: If a Committee boat is on station, a yacht will finish between it and C "3", South of Bennett Point at the mouth of the Wye River. If no Comittee boat is on station, a yacht will finish when C "3" is within 50 yards to port and upon crossing a line extended 230 degrees magnetic from it.

:17.1 nm. DISTANCE

#### STARTING SIGNALS:

1100 - White flag raised - 3 horn blasts

1104 - White flag lowered

1105 - Blue flag raised - 2 horn blasts

1109 - Blue flag lowered

1110 - START - Red flag raised - 1 horn blast

NOTE : Hoisting of flag takes precedence over horn and time of day.

TIME LIMIT :6 hours. One yacht finishing within the time limit makes a race valid for all yachts.

NOTE : The race can be shortened at any turning mark. In that case a yacht will finish between the mark and the Committee boat from the direction of the previous mark. Keep your radio tuned to channel #16 for instructions.

#### SPECIAL INSTRUCTIONS:

1) State your intention to race by sailing past the Committee boat's stern

2) Fly a white flag (approx. 12"x12") from the backstay. 3) Working jibs and genoas only. No spinnakers, drifters, staysails, flashers, etc. No foresail combinations - one headsail only.

# LADIES' RACE\*


Racing's been rotten this year. Wind just wouldn't appear.


