## AND NOW FOR SOMETHING DIFFERENT....

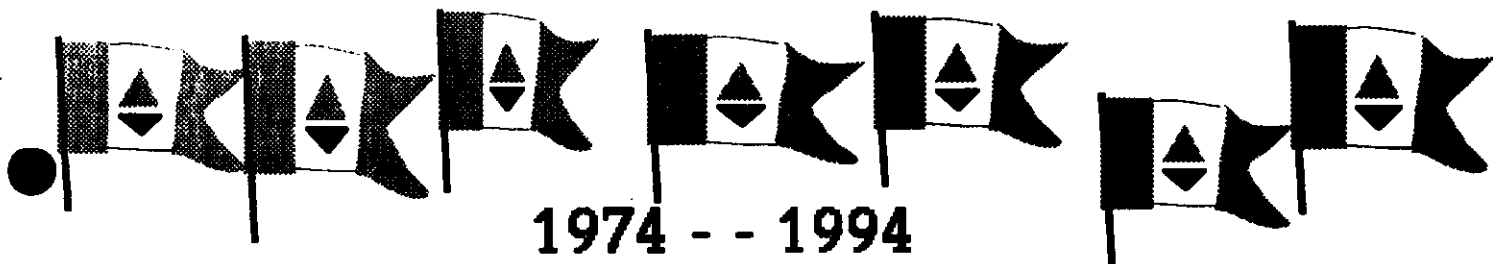

## FIRST.....

Take rt. 97 to rt. 50 towards Annapolis.

FROM RICHMOND AND  
WASHINGTON:

From the Washington beltway take rt.  
50 east to Annapolis

FROM SALISBURY & THE EASTERN  
SHORE:

Take rt. 50 west over the Chesapeake  
Bay Bridge to Annapolis.

## THEN.....

Take Rowe Blvd. Exit to Annapolis.

Stay on Rowe Blvd until it deadends in front of  
the State House.

Turn left onto College Avenue

Go to the first street light, turn right onto King  
George Street.

Go to first street light, turn left onto Maryland  
Avenue.

Go straight to Gate 3.


Dim lights on entering gate area.

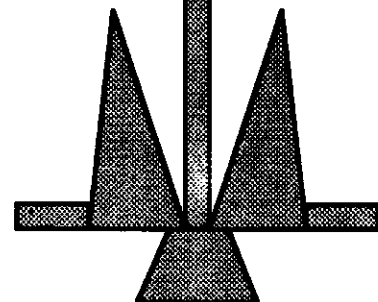

**STRAWBERRY VANILLA CHIP CHEESECAKE**

cut on the dotted  
lines and affix to a  
3 x 5 card for your file  
of favorite recipes!

Prepare Chocolate 'n Cookie Crust;

- 1 1/2 bars (1 1/2 oz.) unsweetened baking chocolate
- 3 T butter or margarine
- 1 C vanilla wafer crumbs.
- 1/2 cup sugar.

Microwave chocolate and butter/margarine in a small bowl for 1 minute at high (100%) or until chocolate is melted when stirred. Stir in wafer crumbs and sugar. Press mix onto bottom and 1/2" up sides of a 9" springform pan. Heat oven to 350 degrees

← fold

In a large bowl, beat together:

- 2 pkgs. (8 oz. each) cream cheese\*, softened
- 2/3 C sugar
- 2 eggs
- 1 t vanilla or strawberry extract.

Stir in: 1 C vanilla milk chips, melted

Pour half the batter into the prepared crust and place over the top: 1 cup sliced fresh strawberries (or 1 10 oz. pkg. frozen strawberries in light syrup, thawed and well drained.)

Cover completely with balance of batter.

Bake 45 min. until all but a 3" circle in center is set. Cool Loosen cake from sides of pan. Cool completely; remove side of pan. Decorate/garnish as desired. Cover and refrigerate. Approximately 12 servings.

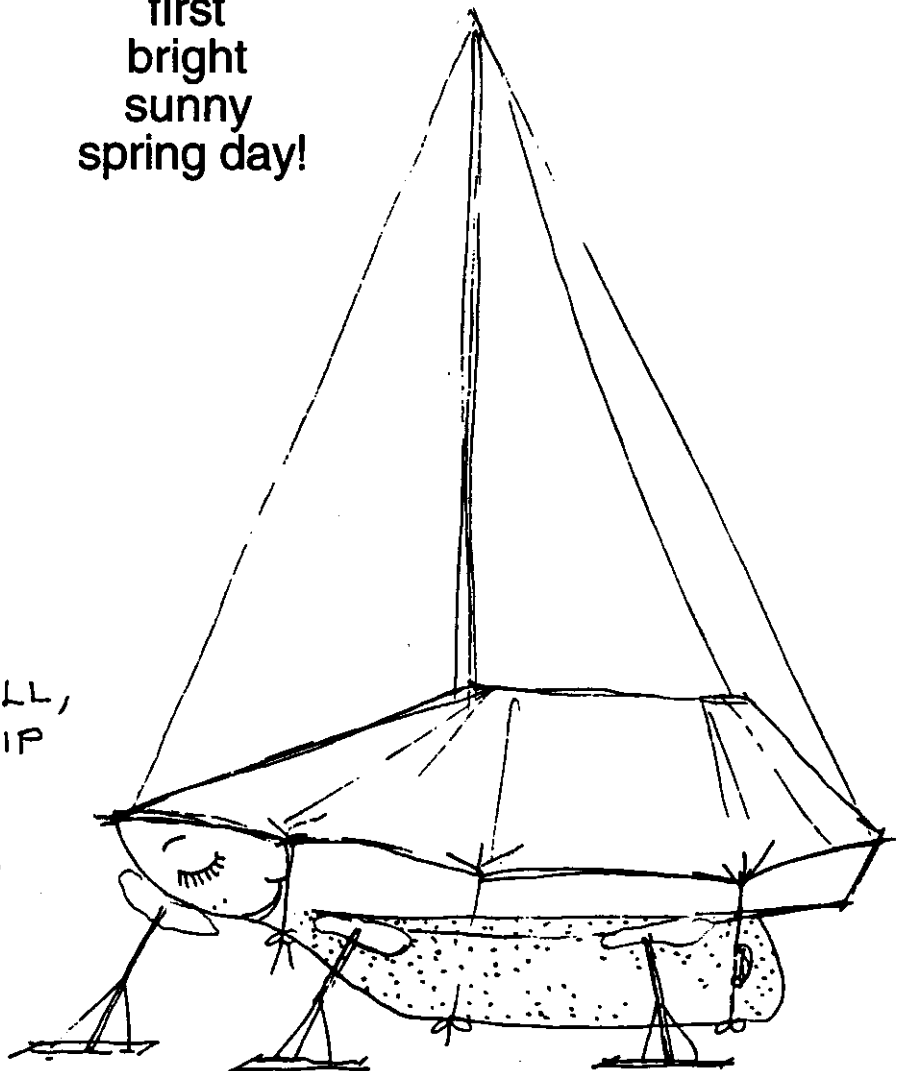
