

For those CBC'ers not "connected" there is a wealth of sailing "activity" going on in the electronic community. America Online has one of the more interesting and active boating forums of all the Online services. If you haven't gotten a free disk or a solicitation from AOL you're spending way too much time on your boat! You can access the Sailing Forum through the "Clubs and Interests" button on the main menu. From there go to "Boating Selections" and on into the "Sailing Forum". Inside there are numerous areas to explore, including owners groups (yes, Bristol is represented!), a West Marine forum, and many other areas addressing electronics, rigging, sails, cruising, etc. You can add your two cents to the "thread" or pass Email to other AOL members, there's even a live "chat" room for real time conversations. I've already met a couple of prospective club members here and forwarded applications. It's a great way to waste away those winter evenings after you've read all your back issues of Cruising World, and Sail for the tenth time. At \$2.95 an hour, it's lots cheaper than other boating related activities!
