

UPDATE FROM CBC NORTHERN *MINI-MINI CRUISE . (*mini-mini = 1 boat)

Greetings from the land of high tides and fog! While the CBC was enjoying its crab feast this weekend, TRUMPETER has been exploring Grand Manan Island. Tidal ranges exceed 20 feet so we're fortunately sungged in alongside a local fishing boat behind the government jetty at North Head. We saw lots of Puffins on our way here as well as a pilot whale which surfaced in our wake. Today we took an island tour and marvelled at the 200 ft. cliffs we passed close by on our way to the island.

Before heading East we spent 4 weeks exploring the stretch of the Maine coast between Camden and Mt. Desert: one gorgeous anchorage after another. July weather was the pits (we had our diesel heater on during one stretch three nights in a row!) Our weather is better now but we've honed up on our skills in the fog. We will explore Campobello and St. Andrews from here before starting our 700 mile trip back to the Chesapeake.

Look forward to sharing our tales with our CBC friends. This has been the experience of a lifetime and its really just beginning! See you in a month.
