Here we go! A message from the Hottles.

Mill and Logan Hottle are hosting the early bird raftup this year, on Saturday and Sunday, May 4 \$ 5, near their house on Almshouse creek. There are lots of neat things to do when you get up the river and drop your hook.

Come in the South River and head for the Solomon's Island Road Bridge. Honor the day marks since the river does shoal pretty quickly on the wrong sides of them. Flashing green # 15 is at the entrance to Almshouse Creek--your destination. NOTE this flashing green is a day mark for the South River and not Almshouse. Leave it to starboard as you enter the creek. The deep water is over to port all the way into the creek. It opens up into a nice rafting area. We will be out there in ACOMES, or in our dinghy, or in "Maryland Heritage" a 40' waterman's boat.

There are quite a few places to go ashore. The community has a very strong rule about picking up after pooches so please be ready to take plastic bags with you. We will point you toward the right area so that there will be trash cans for uour use.

The Londontown Publikhouse is nearby and walkable, but we will have our car available to shuttle anyone who may want to go. The gardens should be lovely this weekend. Meather permitting, there will be cocktails around five o'clock aboard "Maryland Heritage.", which will be in the raft.

Accessibility by land is easy also. Take Route 50 to Route 665 South, then take Route 2 (Solomon's Island Road) South to Mayo Road. This will be in the construction area where Rt. 2 widens to three lanes with a left turn lane for Mayo. At the second light on Mayo turn left on Londontown Road. Pass the fire house and look for Bishop Road on the left. Turn left. Turn right at Shore drive and park along the right hand side. (Will will put a sign on their building lot and you can pull off oh the grass there.) The community dock is at that intersection and the Hottle's lot is on the corner right across from it. Do not park on the water side. That's a permit only area. Call the raft on your handheld, and someone will arrive to transport you.

We look forward to seeing lots of you. Give us a call AS SOON AS POSSIBLE to help us in planning for the party.

BY LAND: (Allow 45 minutes from Annapolis) Take Route 50 East approximately 13 miles from the east end of the Bay Bridge. Turn right outo "Carmichael Road" (at the sign for NWRA and Aspen Institute.) Stay on the main road which becomes "Wye Island Road" along the way.

About 4 miles after leaving Route 50 you will cross a small bridge onto Wye Island.

Continue on the main road (past a sign saying "Wye Island NRMA Conference Lodge, Trails" etc. Do NOT turn off here onto "Wye Hall Drive".)

At about 15 miles from the small bridge you will see a sign on the left, "D.N.R. Conference Lodge"

Turn left and follow all the way to the end, where you will find a parking area near the lodge.

Y SEA: Follow your chart up Easter Bay, the Miles River, and Wye River East to Granary Creek., (beyond Dividing Creek) There is a duck blind on the south side of the river opposite Granary. Stay in the middle of the river 'til you can see straight up the middle of Granary Creek, turn to port and enter. You will find seven to eight feet of water in the center fairly far up the creek and in the cove on the left after you enter. There is a dinghy dock in this cove. You will see the Lodge on the hill to your left after you enter the creek.


CALLISTO CRUISERS IN SEARCH OF SUMMER LODGING AND **BICYCLES**
