Please note this special request from Raftmaster Norm:

"All chain" anchoring systems are very difficult to manage in a Sunflower rafting situation; if you normally use chain, please switch to a nylon anchor rode if at all possible.

**IF YOU CANNOT SAIL TO THE SUNFLOWER, TALK TO A BUDDY TO ARRANGE A DINGHY PICKUP. YOU CAN PARK YOUR CAR AT CANTLERS, AND CALL YOUR BUDDY BY CELL PHONE. THE MORE THE MERRIER !**
