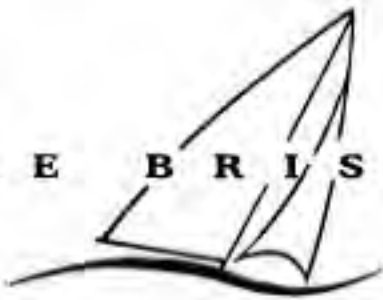

I'm excited about the year to come with the terrific, creative leaders who are taking over.

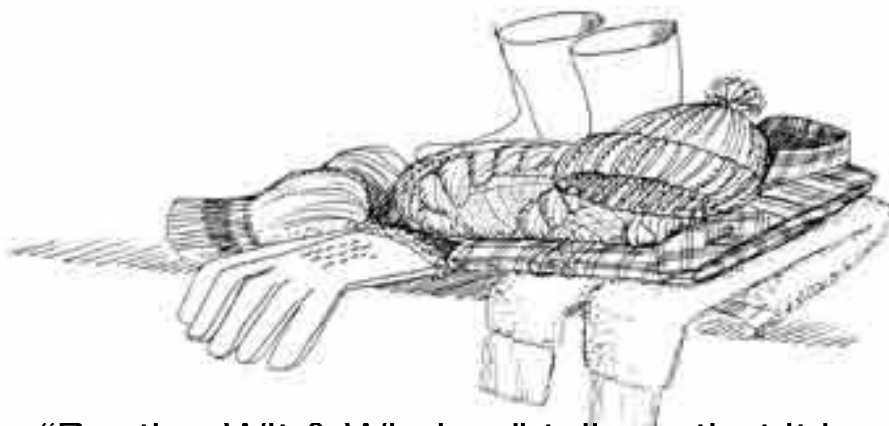
