

Here is the recipe for that great Harvey Wallbanger Cake:

1 pkg. lemon deluxe cake mix
1 pkg. instant vanilla pudding
1/2 cup salad oil
4 eggs
1/4 cup vodka; 1/4 cup Galliano (1/4 cup = 2 miniatures)
1/2 cup orange juice
Mix all ingredients together and beat 4 minutes
Pour batter into well greased and lightly floured (use dry cake mix) bundt pan. Bake at 350 for 45-50 minutes. NO LONGER!

Dust with confectioner's sugar or frost with a glaze made with powdered sugar, pinch of salt, and thinned with orange juice or Galliano.

Scott Doran makes this cake using different ingredients such as Bailey's Irish Cream. Keep the amounts of liquid the same and experiment!

EDUCATIONAL CRUISE ABOARD THE LADY MARYLAND.

At the Spring meeting, enough interest was expressed in chartering the Lady Maryland, a Chesapeake Bay Schooner, that is owned and operated by the Living Classrooms Foundation. I have spoken to the scheduler, and the only date that is available, whilst not clashing with our calendar of events, is Sunday, October 28. It follows the Halloween Barbecue Party on October 27. The ship would leave from pier 5 in Baltimore harbor at 9:30 and return at 2:30. During the 5-hour trip, the instructions will cover the raising and lowering of sails, trawling for marine life (oysters), performing scientific tests and exploring the commerce, history, natural resources and ecosystems of the Chesapeake Bay. The minimum age is 4th grade. Food is not provided so we would have to arrange something; details to follow.



The cost of a charter is \$750 and a maximum of 32 passengers can be accommodated. This works out at \$23.44 per person. At the Spring meeting, 20 people expressed an interest, which works out at \$37.50. Since everyone could not attend the meeting, I expect more will sign up. If the final tally turns out to be less than 20, then the booking would not go ahead. Currently, the date is being held for us and a \$200 deposit is required to confirm the booking with the balance due a week before the cruise.

If enough interest is shown, then an initial deposit not to exceed \$10 per person would be required.
